- a. A copy of this Letter.
- b. A curriculum vitae (2-page maximum) that indicates 2 years' experience in the nursing care of the trauma or pediatric patient.
- c. A letter expressing your commitment and interest in teaching future ENPC, minimum of 2 per year. Please indicate your willingness and availability to travel with the course.
- d. Letter of recommendation from a colleague/supervisor.
