- Licensed or eligible for licensure with the Nova Scotia College of Nursing (NSCN)

- CTAS (Canadian Triage and Acuity Scale) required
- EPICC – Foundations (Emergency Practice, Interventions and Care – Canada) or TNCC (Trauma Nursing Core Course) required
- Current RQI BLS or, BLS-C (Basic Life Support – C) required
- Current RQI ALS or, ACLS – (Advanced Cardiac Life Support) required
- Current RQI PALS or, PALS (Pediatric Advanced Life Support); EPICC – Pediatrics (Emergency Practice, Interventions and Care – Canada) or ENPC (Emergency Nurses Pediatric Course) required
- Trauma course – EPICC - Trauma (Emergency Practice, Interventions and Care – Canada); Rural Trauma Program or TNCC (Trauma Nursing Core Course) required
- Emergency Nursing Program or Critical Care Nursing Program an asset
- ENC (C) Certification an asset
